The Battle of Lepanto,

in 1571, was a non-religious significance, because that it was the last major naval battle in Western history, which was to be fought primarily between large fleets of oared galleys.

Some unknown vague sources here note that the Western's ships were the first to place canons on their prows/bows.

Furthermore, at least before, probably some place early sailors, throw rocks, shoot arrows and/or fire fiery catapults!

In any event, the battle was an END of an age of oaring warships, and “announced” this: the
“AGE of SAIL”

of the relationship of

and the
Battle of Lepanto:



Early as 1560, bishops of Rome were devoted about the apparitions, which were in Mexico in 1531.

The Archbishop of Mexico sent, in 1570, to King Phillip II of Spain, an “exact copy” of the sacred/celestial/mysterious image upon the cloak/tilma/poncho.

Admiral Andrea Doria, the Christian/Western’s Holy League fleet leader, was received the copy and placed it in his cabin in the flagship during the victorious battle.
